

- Person's name**
First & last name and correct spelling
Ex. Ellen, Ella, Elene -- McNeil, McNeal, O'Neal, Oneill
Name variations, Actual, Ethnic, Latin, Pet names
Phonetic variations & alternatives (Patrick, Patrick C.)
- Date of Birth**
Day, month, year (calendar)
Not registration date or baptism date
- Birth Location**
Exact location of birth
Last residence in Ireland
- 3.5 Distinguishing Information**
Personal information, distinguishing details
Distinguishing features (age, built, scars)
Distinguishing factors (occupation, friends)

 - Court records
 - Census records
 - Military records
 - Land records
 - Tax records
 - Depart/Arrival ship records
 - Tithing records
 - Church records
 - Obits
- Why so few Irish records?**
 - Little money
 - Lost in battle
 - Destroyed by owner
 - Government changes
 - Many sharecroppers
 - Elders got it all
 - Burned by invaders

- Interment Cards, Family Plots
- Death Certificates
- County release date
- Stone date
- Burial location & map

- Grave locations, photos
- Names and dates
- Origins and ages
- Other family members
- Fruit from clusters

Key Words

Human migration is the movement of people from one place to another with intentions of settling, permanently or temporarily, at a new location. The movement often occurs over long distances and from one country to another

Internal migration is the dominant form of human migration globally

Emigration is the act of **leaving** a resident country or place of residence with the intent to settle elsewhere (to permanently leave a country)

Immigration describes the movement of people **entering** one country from another (to permanently move to a country)

Migrant is a **person** who **emigrates** from their old country and **immigrates** to their new country

Thus, both emigration and immigration describe migration, but from different perspectives

William died a widower on 23 May 1939 (65) in Clark County, Ohio
He is buried in Calvary Cemetery in Springfield, Clark County, Ohio

Dorothy Ellen Glynn McNeil

Dorothy Ellen Glynn was born in Ireland c1875 (Census 1910 - 35 years)
She had five children in the 1910 Census; Edith, Edna, Elouise, Millard, and Irene
She Immigrated to the US in 1888 (according to the 1900 US Census, Ohio)

Dorothy Ellen Glynn was married 20 Jun 1898
She appears in the death notice for her mother
Her mother was Bridget Glynn

Dorothy Ellen Glynn McNeil

Dorothy Ellen Glynn died 18 Apr 1928 in Springfield, Clark Co, Ohio
She was buried first at St Bernard's Cemetery and later moved to Calvary Cemetery

John McNeil was born in Ireland c 1830. He came to the US in c1852
In 1900 he lived in Jefferson Township, Madison County with wife Ann
John's wife Ann was born in May 1836 in Ireland came to the US in 1860






